Reading Appalachia from Left to Right Carol Mason 2011-02-23 In *Reading Appalachia from Left to Right*, Carol Mason examines the legacies of a pivotal 1974 curriculum dispute in West Virginia that heralded the rightward shift in American culture and politics.
